Program Objectives and Policies

Candidates for institutional assistance must be in good academic standing, enrolled full time and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). In accordance with the institutional mission of MSPP, priority in the awarding of funds is given to candidates who demonstrate superior academic merit and a strong commitment to community and/or public service activities.

Important Priority Due Dates and Reply Instructions

The **2012-2013 FAFSA** and the **Institutional Application for Financial Assistance** are due at MSPP **on or before March 1, 2012**. Institutional applications and FAFSAs received after the due date will be considered for awards, subject to the availability of remaining funding.

Verification of Financial Need

As a condition of awarding institutional assistance, MSPP may require verification of reported income, assets, and household size. MSPP reserves the right to modify an award if an applicant's FAFSA information changes or if corrections are required.

Any student not making SAP (satisfactory academic progress) or not enrolled full time (as defined by their program) is no longer eligible to receive institutional assistance.
